ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

William Shakespeare (1564-1616) was born and raised in Stratford-Upon-Avon, a town about 100 miles northwest of London, England. Widely regarded as the greatest dramatist in the English language, he is the author of at least 38 plays and 154 sonnets. Some of his most famous plays are *Hamlet, Romeo and Juliet, Macbeth, King Lear, Julius Caesar, Twelfth Night, Othello, The Taming of the Shrew,* and *A Midsummer Night's Dream.* In addition to influencing countless writers, Shakespeare influenced the English language. He is credited with inventing about 2,000 words that are still in use today (although he may have stolen a few, himself), and many of our common phrases and clichés were first uttered over 400 years ago in a Shakespeare play. What's most remarkable is how well Shakespeare seems to have understood human behavior at its best and worst, and how much his writing still can teach us about ourselves.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Jeffrey Fracé directed Cowboy Mouth, Once Upon a Time 6x in the West, Harp Song for a Radical, Barbarians, Untying My Cement Shoes, and The Two Orphans for UW Drama. His other directing credits include original work in Seattle and New York, and many Shakespeare productions for Stonington Opera House and Arkansas Shakespeare Theatre. He has more than 70 acting credits including On the Boards and ACT Theatre in Seattle, as well as the Kennedy Center, New York Shakespeare Festival, American Repertory Theatre, Actors Theatre of Louisville, Alabama Shakespeare Festival, Nashville Shakespeare Festival, Stonington Opera House, Cleveland Public Theatre, Chopin Theatre Chicago, La MaMa ETC, and the Iberoamericano Festival of Bogota. He is a former Associate Artist of Anne Bogart's SITI Company, performing, touring, and teaching with the company for over 10 years. He teaches acting, directing, movement, and devising theater in the MFA program for the UW School of Drama and holds an MFA in Acting from Columbia University.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I directed *As You Like It* for the first time in 2006, in Maine, with a company of actors from New York City. At the time we were nearly six years into the presidency of George W. Bush, and the war in Iraq was ongoing. I was thinking about Eisenhower's military industrial complex speech, and so the idea to set the play around that time started there. I wanted to give the darkness I was feeling about the 2006 political climate a little distance and perspective. Like Rosalind and Celia, I was eager to escape to the Forest of Arden.

Together with my company of actors and designers, we made a kind of escape. We didn't leave the world, but we made the best of it by cooking and eating together, playing our instruments and singing and dancing a lot, and clowning around. A few months later in New York City, we presented a show called Conni's Avant Garde Restaurant with the premise that we wanted to share our food, song, and clowning with audiences.

This a special show for me, and I'm thrilled to re-discover it with this company at UW in 2017. It seems to me that now, as much as ever, it's a good time to come together, to sing and laugh, and to do the things that strengthen our ties to each other and our sense of community.
