

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Program Spotlight:

The MFA Directing Program at the School of Drama

Interaction between actors and directors in rehearsal is a crucial element of a director's professional career. Improvement of a director's ability to relate to actors in this creative crucible is considered extremely important by our faculty. The Directing Lab, in which directing students are observed constantly during the rehearsal of a project, forms the core of the training. To further facilitate director-actor collaboration, we have combined our MFA Programs in Acting and Directing into one Performance Training Program which is served by eight faculty.

The School of Drama has a wealth of theatrical spaces in which to work: arena, thrust, black box and end-stage configurations. MFA directing students have the unique opportunity of working in all of these configurations—the greatest staging variety of any school in the nation. The rigorous training includes work in a range of types and styles of dramatic literature including non-realistic, realistic, classical, and contemporary plays. The program emphasizes the development of unique artistic visions and voices. The development of generative and exciting theatre artists is at the core of this emphasis. The overall aim of the program is to provide students with the practical skills necessary to clearly and fully reveal their artistic ideas and which will allow them to be effective collaborators with actors and designers.

About the Author

No contemporary playwright has been as successful as Tom Stoppard in creating what have been termed "serious comedies" -- funny plays that deal with important ideas. His efforts have been recognized and rewarded with many awards for playwriting, including three Tonys on Broadway. He has received quite a number of honorary degrees and was honored with a knighthood in the United Kingdom.

Tom Stoppard's earliest writing was as a newspaper journalist after he quit school at the age of seventeen. He began writing his first plays in the 1960s with *A Walk on the Water* and won his first critical acclaim with *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead* in 1965. Since then he has written many television scripts, radio plays, short stories, film scripts (including *Brazil*, *The Russia House*, *Billy Bathgate*, *Empire of the Sun* and *Shakespeare in Love*) and over forty plays. Stoppard's recent successes include *The Invention of Love*, and his trilogy, *The Coast of Utopia*, currently at Lincoln Center in New York City. His newest play, *Rock 'n' Roll*, has just closed in London's West End. It is set to open on Broadway Fall of '07.

Stoppard is considered to be a master of comic invention, visual humor, and remarkably witty wordplay. *Arcadia* is considered one of his greatest plays.
