### ABOUT THE **PLAYWRIGHT**

William Shakespeare, playwright, penned over 37 plays in his lifetime, nearly all of which are still performed today, hundreds of years after they were first published. By 1592 he was an established figure, touring with his troupe throughout England. In 1599 he became a partner in the new Globe Theatre. He retired to Stratford on Avon in 1612 where he continued to be active in real estate investment until his death in 1616.

"Your wits makes wise things foolish." Are we truly who we say we are? Can words be as effective a disguise as a mask? The essence of a promise is that it must be spoken/made to another, but can language ever really suffice? Often the sanctuaries we construct to hide ourselves from the world are made of much more than personas: words themselves are powerful enough, in that they can fortify what we protect and destroy what we wish to possess at the same time. Perhaps that is why Shakespeare asks us to laugh at this contradiction, for laughter is what reminds us of our humanity best.
