

María Irene Fornés died on October 30, 2018. She was a titan in our field who will be sorely missed.

So, why this play? Why now?

Because María Irene Fornés will continue to be an inspiration to theatre artists. Because she nurtured and coaxed art from everyone she met. Because we need reminders that we can only create the world we want to see by first fiercely challenging the world as it is. She did that and so much more.

The play was written during a period of women's consciousness-raising. It looks back to a time before the modern Women's Movement. It questions the male gaze and implicates us all in continuing to perpetuate internalized sexism and classism. The acknowledgment of the ways that women are challenged and support each other is a powerful message even today. Perhaps, especially today.

María Irene Fornés left a legacy as an advocate for finding and using one's voice. The testimonials that have poured out since her death underscore her significance. My hope is that our production will keep that legacy alive.
