ABOUT PEARLDAMOUR

We are an Obie-Award winning collaborative team who create performance both inside and outside traditional theater spaces. We are known for large-scale performances that mix theater and installation — such as *How to Build a Forest*, in which we assemble and disassemble a simulated forest on an empty stage over eight hours — and intimate performances designed for small audiences — such as *Bird Eye Blue Print*, created for a set of small vacant offices in the World Financial Center in Manhattan. Over our 15-year history of making work together, we have devised a body of work that is attentive to the performer / audience relationship, and searches for new approaches to narrative through the accumulation of text, image, physicality and architectural elements. We want our audiences to feel like they are inside of an experience, rather than watching something happen "over there." When we make a show we create room for the audience to feel like they have slipped into the private headspace of a performer they are watching: an intimate, associative, surprising place.

DIRECTORS'NOTE

Sometimes you ask a group of students to leave campus and go for a walk - with the sole purpose of really hearing the sounds, noticing the smells, and seeing the people they pass. Sometimes in the first 20 minutes of talking to a stranger they tell you a story that brings you to tears. Sometimes you daydream about weaving all those stories and experiences together to make a show! Skies Over Seattle (SOS) was inspired by PearlDamour + Ashley Sparks' national project called MILTON. Since 2012, we have been visiting small towns named Milton across the country, talking to residents about their lives and world views, hosting art activities, volunteering at town events, and then making a performance that reflects our experiences to share with each town. Our Milton research focuses as much on community engagement as it does on play-building; we see the two processes as one and the same. Over the last 9 months we've facilitated a similar process between students and 3 different communities in the U-District. SOS is a collage of reflections, stories, windows and fragmented glimpses of student experiences with these communities. Built from elements of the individual performances they did in each community, SOS is our opportunity to bring these communities into one room, under one shared sky and ask: What does it mean to be a resident of the U-District? What will help us go beyond our assumptions and become more awake to seeing and being with our U-District neighbors? We invite you to be a witness to the people and sounds we sometimes rush past. Reflect on your own experiences of the myriad of people who live here and then share your stories with us.

ABOUT ASHLEY SPARKS

Southern theatre maker and engagement strategist. She has worked nationally with companies such as Cornerstone Theater Company in Los Angeles – recently managing community partnerships in 9 cities for a state wide tour; was an ensemble member with ArtSpot Productions in New Orleans, and is core collaborator on PearlDamour's MILTON. She was the Project Director for the Network of Ensemble Theater's MicroFests in Detroit, Honolulu, Knoxville, Minneapolis, Atlanta, Philadelphia, Los Angeles and New Orleans. Directing Credits include: *Expatriate* by Lenelle Moïses at the CD Forum, *Go Ye Therefore* by ArtSpot Productions, *La Pastorela de Yakima* by DXM Theater, New Works Festival at the University of Redlands. Currently, she is producing *Patriot Act*, a solo show and engagement experiment following the election season. She is a Princess Grace Honoraria and holds an MFA in Directing and Public Dialogue from Virginia Tech.
