

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

THE PROFESSIONAL ACTOR TRAINING PROGRAM (PATP)

The PATP is a three-year conservatory program leading to a Master of Fine Arts degree, designed to prepare students for careers in the professional theatre. Ten actors are chosen every year from national auditions of more than 1,000 candidates. The rigorous training includes work in a range

of types and styles of performance, including non-realistic, realistic, classical and contemporary plays. The program is intense and demanding, with actors working from 9-5, Monday-Friday, with an additional 25 hours per week spent in rehearsals. The overall aim of the program is to provide students with the practical skills necessary to fully reveal their artistic ideas. The PATP is consistently ranked among the very best graduate training programs in the nation.

Director's Notes

The seed of the idea for this production came from an approach to learning dialects, which I've developed, where an actor interviews someone with an accent and that interview becomes a text. As Anna Deavere Smith has done in her landmark productions, we remain faithful to every detail (chuckle, umm, stumble) in the speaking. In this process, the actor is seeking transformation by starting with the end result and then filling in with the imagination, rather than the more common route, which does the opposite. Almost all the words in this play come from those we interviewed and miraculously the person emerges. We portray them with the utmost respect.

The idea to give these interviews the theme of humor came from Sarah Nash Gates. My husband, Jay, coined the title, *Humor Me*. As I began to ponder the daunting task of presenting humor as an evening of theatre, I began to look at my own relationship to laughter. We say that 'laughter is infectious', and I began to think: perhaps *lack of laughter* is also infectious. Thus began the framework of the play. This production has taught me to seek out the laughs in every day life.

In our world, fraught with daily disaster and the relentless threat of more, I'm certain that we all could use more laughter in our lives. The latest scientific research shows that laughter boosts the immune system, releases endorphins and merely the anticipation of laughter will increase the release of beta endorphins and human growth hormone (HGH).

I hope that, as you're reading this, you're anticipating a good laugh and that you'll be 'infected' (in a healthy way) by tonight's musings.
